NAPLAN March 13th to 25th 2024: Why do students do NAPLAN tests?

The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracv.

The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN tests are just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process; they do not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance.

NAPLAN tests also provide schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are meeting important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

MPS HOUSE CROSS COUNTRY 2024 INFORMATION

This year our House Cross Country event will be held on the last day of Term 1, Thursday March 28th.

This is a whole school event and all students will compete to earn points for their house, Hollows, Chisolm or Freeman. If you are unsure of your house, please see Jan or your classroom teacher.

Students will walk down to the Malmsbury Cricket Ground as a whole school for the event at 9:15 after morning classroom routines. The following events will be held:

- Prep/Year 1 Fun Run around the inside of the oval, 1 lap, approximately 500m
- Year 2 Fun Run around the inside of the oval, 2 laps, approximately 1km
- 9 and 10 year olds 2km track
- 11 and 12/13 year olds 3km track

Age groups are calculated as age turned by Dec 31 2024. The attached map shows the track, 2 laps for 9 and 10 year olds and 3 laps for 11 and 12/13 year olds.

Students will have their morning snack at the oval and we will return to school for lunch then 2:30pm dismissal. House colours can be worn, however clothing needs to be appropriate to run in and SunSmart with shoulders covered.

I have spoken with students about training ideas if they are interested. This could involve:

- Visiting the cricket ground and running the track
- Going for a jog at home on an family agreed route
- Running laps of the school oval during recess or lunch time

Closer to the date I will be asking for parent volunteers to stand at checkpoints so please check your calendars and keep it free to come along and support our students!





AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

Prep/1:

This week in the Prep/One room, the Preps have started looking at the sounds that letters make. We are very clever Gumnuts, so we use correct vocabulary to describe what we are learning. We are learning to match the phonemes (sound) to the graphemes (letter shape). This week we have studied the phonemes 's' and 'a', so if you hear your loved one saying "s, s, s, sun", woohoo!!! Next week, we will explore 't' and 'p' and will start to put these sounds together to work out simple words!

Fun Fact: There are at least 10 frequently used words you can make with these 4 letters, (apparently, there is 22, but some of them I have never heard of!) and then when we study 'i and n' in the following week, there are 106 words that can be made using these the SATPIN phonemes!!!

Grade 1 students have been busy revising the vowel teams we learnt at the end of last term, we have looked at the long 'a' digraph, 'ai' and 'ay' and this week we have moved onto the vowel team that makes the long 'e' sound, 'ee' and 'ea'. It is really tricky to know what vowel team to use when writing our words, but an easy 'rule' can help us: Use 'ea' if the word connected to food/meals or wet words, eg. eat, feast ' and use 'ee' if it is associated things in nature, eg. tree, sheep. But with every rule there is exceptions, and there are so many exceptions in the English language!







Grade 2/3:

This week in the Grade 2/3 classroom, we have been learning how to identify different types of verbs and the way they add meaning to a sentence. We have learnt that some verbs have helping and linking roles. These roles are changed based on the subject and the tense (past, present, future) of our writing. I have been very impressed with how well the students have absorbed all this information, and how they have already started implementing this new knowledge in their writing. Next week, we will learn how to create more interesting sentences, by including an adjective in our writing

Grade 3/4:

This week has been another great week in the Grade 3 /4.

In Writing we have been building our understanding of coordinating conjunctions. These are words that join two independent ideas, or clauses, together to make a compound sentence. We use the acronym FANBOYS to remember which words are coordinating conjunctions. They are: for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so. We wrote some silly sentences on beetle wings and had a go at using these words to join them together. Some of them are easier to use than others!! Check out our wacky sentences@

In maths we have focused on rounding to the nearest ten or hundred. We thought this might be pretty easy, but it was a little bit harder than we thought! We need to round numbers sometimes so that they are easier to work with, particularly if they are really big numbers!

We have also started investigating how the Earth's surface can be changed, in preparation for our exciting Earth Ed excursion next week.



Grade 5/6:

In Auslan this week, students made up their own sign for their names. Some used the signs of their interests, letters in their names, and some even used signs of cities, to create their own individual sign name. For Inquiry this term, we are asking the question, 'How can we be the best version of ourselves?'. Students are learning what it means to have a growth mindset and have begun researching 'famous failures'.

SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

For 2024, school council elections must be completed by March 31st.

School Council members are elected to serve for a period of 2 years. This year we have the following members whose 2 year tenure is coming to a close:

This means that there will be a call for nominations for 4 parent positions to be filled for the next 2 years (Community Members are appointed through a different system). Vacating councillors are more than welcome to nominate for the positions again. If there are more nominations than vacant positions, we will then work through a voting process to appoint people to the positions.

MALMSBURY PS CATASTROPHIC FIRE RATING DAY PROCEDURES

With the Bushfire Season upon us, it is important to know the following information and process.

Malmsbury PS is on the 'Bushfire At Risk' register. This means that our school is closed on any Catastrophic Day and our OSHC service will also be closed. Below is our procedure to inform our school community of any Catastrophic Rating days that are declared.


Malmsbury PS does not operate on a Catastrophic Day and no staff or students are permitted to be on the school premises.

Catastrophic Days are declared at least 24 hours in advance.

If a Catastrophic Day is declared during the school week then a note will be sent home from school to alert families to the school closure.

A follow up phone call or Sentral message requiring a confirmation will confirm each family has received the notification regarding the Catastrophic closure.

- Staff will be phoned to confirm they know the school will be closed due to a Catastrophic Day being called.
- If a Catastrophic day is declared over a weekend for a Monday we will use the Sentral app, Facebook and phone calls to let parents know our school will be closed. Senior staff members will have home access to parent contact numbers in a secure location to enable parents to be contacted on weekends.
- Staff will be called to notify them of the Catastrophic Day closure declared over the weekend.
- Parents and staff will be reminded to monitor weather warnings over weekends until the bushfire season is over.
- Regular reminders will be placed in the newsletter about regularly checking the Sentral app and to follow us on Facebook for any notifications.
