Crossing the road at the north end of Cameron St:

It has been brought to my attention that there has been some concerns about students being aware of how to cross the road at the north end of Cameron st, at the Church crossover to the school side of the footpath. I will be contacting MRSC local laws unit to investigate options for this cross over to the school. In the meantime, we ask that students and families wait back from the edge of the road and signal cars to pass through before crossing. We will also look at putting some painted lines on the path, well back from the road edge to signal where to wait before crossing the road. When driving, we ask that drivers continue to drive past at walking pace in this area and to not stop and encourage students to cross. This is where some confusion for our young students has occurred. Students have been spoken to about how to use this crossing—standing back from the road and waving cars through and waiting for parents walking with them to give the ok to cross. Thank you for your attention to this important information as we look at how we can make this crossing area safer.

Smile Squad is coming to this school

The Smile Squad team from Bendigo Health are coming to our school in the week of May 27th to the 31st (exact days to be confirmed).

Smile Squad is the Victorian Government free school dental program.

This means all students can get a free dental check-up, preventive services, and treatment at school.

How to access free dental care

We need your consent before we can provide services. Consent is usually provided by a parent or guardian.

Paper copies of the consent form are available. Please contact the school office if you would like to request one.

The electronic consent form can be translated into more than 100 languages, and the paper form is available in 13 languages.

Smile Squad dental packs

All children deserve a healthy smile, and the Smile Squad free school dental program is working hard to help make sure this happens.

Your child(ren) will soon receive a free dental pack to bring home. The dental pack contains a tooth-brush, full sized toothpaste, and an oral health brochure. Please take the time to read the brochure. It's full of helpful hints and tips to help your whole family eat well, drink well and clean well – for life.

Smile Squad provides standard strength fluoride toothpaste that is generally used by ages six and over, unless recommended by a dental or trained health professional.

If your child is under six, please talk to a dental or trained health professional to find out if your child might benefit from using this toothpaste. You can also choose to put the toothpaste away until they turn six or give it to someone else in your family to use.

Do I need to attend my child's appointment?

No, you do not need to attend your child's appointment. You can attend if you would like to, and you can take your child to the community dental clinic if you prefer.
