## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

## CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$150 for primary school students
- · \$250 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.





## AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

## **Grade Prep/1**

Check out these photos from the Prep/1 room... using our environment as a classroom, and anything we find in nature as our learning tools. We took our learning down to the Frog Bog for our maths session last week, trying to make the most of our last warm, pleasant days. We used a variety of rocks, pebbles and sticks to make patterns, investigate measurement and make 'Friends of Ten' (2+8, 5+5, 7+3 etc). Watching the pure delight and intense engagement in learning always thrills the soul and reinforces why I do, what I do









## Grade 2/3

This week in the Grade 2/3 classroom, we have wrapped up our mathematics unit focusing on data collection and representation. We have been learning how to collect and classify data into visual representations using various types of graphs, including picture graphs, column graphs, line graphs and pie charts. We collaborated to create a pie chart, gathering data based on our birth months. Students gathered in a circle on the mat and arranged themselves according to their birth months, mimicking the structure of a pie chart. Afterwards, students utilised the picture I captured to sketch their individual pie charts. This activity proved to be both enjoyable and engaging, providing students with a novel approach to representing their data.



## AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

Grade 3/4
This week in our Writing sessions we have been learning how to write a proper paragraph. We have learnt that a parameter of the property of the should and supporting details that graph has a topic sentence that tells the reader what the paragraph is going to be about, and supporting details that tell us more abut the topic. We have been practising listing details about a given topic, writing a topic sentence and 2 or 3 sentences that provide more detail. It has been tricky not going straight into the detail in our first sentence, but we are getting the hang of it. We have learnt that the last sentence in a paragraph is the concluding sentence, but we are still getting our heads around writing these.

We've been using a 'hamburger' planner to help us understand the structure - the 'bun' on top is the topic sentence, the burger, lettuce and tomato are the supporting details, and the bun on the bottom is the concluding sentence. We wrote about fantastic creatures to practise using a proper paragraph structure.

## Grade 5/6

We have had a great start to Term 2 in the 5/6 classroom. As part of Inquiry this term, students have been investigating Ricketts Point Marine Sanctuary on Bunurong Country. We have researched the organisms that call Ricketts Point home and how they fit into the ecosystem. Students have learnt how sea urchins in the area have adapted to their changing habitat, and the importance of keeping their population at sustainable levels. We have also learnt about new sustainable uses for seaweed, as well as the traditional uses of the Bunurong People.

In literacy, students are finalising their persuasive letters to Tanya Plibersek about the use of renewable and nonrenewable energy sources in Australia. I have been really impressed with the student's formal language, and strong persuasive techniques so far.

In maths, students have been challenging themselves with increasingly difficult BODMAS calculations. It's been fantastic to watch them persevere with trickier questions. We have just started our unit on data representation and have begun to collect weather forecast data with the 3/4 class. In two weeks, we will be able to share our graphs comparing forecasted weather with actual weather!

The Smile Squad team from Bendigo Health are coming to our school in the week of May 27th to the 31st (exact days to be confirmed).

This means all students can get a free dental check-up, preventive services, and treatment at school.

Paper copies of the consent form are available. Please contact the school office if you would like to request one.

The electronic consent form can be translated into more than 100 languages, and the paper form is available in 13 languages.

#### **Smile Squad dental packs**

All children deserve a healthy smile, and the Smile Squad free school dental program is working hard to help make sure this happens.

Your child(ren) will soon receive a free dental pack to bring home. The dental pack contains a tooth-brush, full sized toothpaste, and an oral health brochure. Please take the time to read the brochure. It's full of helpful hints and tips to help your whole family eat well, drink well and clean well – for life.

Smile Squad provides standard strength fluoride toothpaste that is generally used by ages six and over, unless recommended by a dental or trained health professional.

If your child is under six, please talk to a dental or trained health professional to find out if your child might benefit from using this toothpaste. You can also choose to put the toothpaste away until they turn six or give it to someone else in your family to use.

### Do I need to attend my child's appointment?

No, you do not need to attend your child's appointment. You can attend if you would like to, and you can take your child to the community dental clinic if you prefer.
