

As you can see from the information above, there has been a fantastic shift in our attendance rates over the past two years. It is an amazing effort to have the shifts that we have seen. This has enabled a great effect on student learning along with the huge positive shifts we have seen in school connectedness, learning confidence, and their sense of belonging at school. All of these factors have also had a positive growth effect on student learning.

As you can see from the data from our 2024 Year To Date, we are well on track to bring our attendance data into line with and to be above our like school, network school, and state data.

The table on the right can help you to see where your child's attendance rate compares with the effect on learning. You can check your individual child's attendance rate on the Sentral Parent.

Your child's attendance is on or above 95%

They are likely to be a "Star Performer" as well as an excellent attendee. They will almost certainly achieve the best grades for their ability and have real opportunity in further education, or in the world of work.

Your child's attendance is 90-94%

"GREEN for GO" for good attendance, they are likely to achieve grades that will give them real opportunities to continuing their studies or in the world of work.

Your child's attendance is 85-89%

"AMBER - Take Care" as students will be missing up to 20 days each year and this will make it very difficult for them to achieve their best.

Your child's attendance is 80-84%

"RED light - Be Alert" as students are missing so much school that it will be very difficult for them to keep in touch with lessons or with work.

Your child's attendance is below 80%

"AT RISK - Immediate Action Needed" as students are missing so much time from school that it will be almost impossible for them to keep in touch with lessons or with work.

Portal or Sentral App. Select your child in the app, from the tab at the top, select student details, then under your child's picture, select attendance. From this area you will be able to see your child's percentage attendance for each term, plus the overall percentage for the year to date.

# **Grade Prep/1:**

This week in the Prep/1 room, we have been extremely busy incorporating the Olympics into our week! We have written about being an Olympian. We wrote our first draft in our books, and then typed up our work and illustrated it with a drawing of ourselves competing in our chosen sport. This was the first time for the Preppies, engaging in and completing the whole writing process. We also made paper planes and catapults and measured how long/high we could get our planes and pompoms. Maths can be so much fun! Check out the great writing the Prep/1's have achieved!








# **Grade 2/3:**

Grade 2/3 kicked off their Potato Olympics project this week by transforming their potatoes into impressive Olympians. The students engaged in a variety of math activities that drew on their existing knowledge. They practiced measuring lengths and identifying objects that were heavier or lighter than their creatively decorated spuds. The students measured the length their potatoes travelled after rolling them and recorded the splash made when their potatoes dove into water. This hands-on approach combined measurement skills with a fun, interactive activity, reinforcing their understanding of both math and science concepts. We also delved into the history of the Olympics and explored the significance of each colour in the Olympic rings. The students learnt about the origins of the Games and discovered that the five interlocking rings represent the unity of the five continents involved, with each colour symbolising a different area of the world. The Potato Olympics project not only sparked their creativity and enthusiasm but also provided valuable learning experiences in measurement and the history of the Games. By engaging in these activities, they connected math and science concepts to a fun, real-world context, deepening their understanding and making their learning experience both memorable and enjoyable.




