

As you can see from the information above, there has been a fantastic shift in our attendance rates over the past two years. It is an amazing effort to have the shifts that we have seen. This has enabled a great effect on student learning along with the huge positive shifts we have seen in school connectedness, learning confidence, and their sense of belonging at school. All of these factors have also had a positive growth effect on student learning.

As you can see from the data from our 2024 Year To Date, we are well on track to bring our attendance data into line with and to be above our like school, network school, and state data.

The table on the right can help you to see where your child's attendance rate compares with the effect on learning. You can check your individual child's attendance rate on the Sentral Parent.

Your child's attendance is on or above 95%

They are likely to be a "Star Performer" as well as an excellent attendee. They will almost certainly achieve the best grades for their ability and have real opportunity in further education, or in the world of work.

Your child's attendance is 90-94%

"GREEN for GO" for good attendance, they are likely to achieve grades that will give them real opportunities to continuing their studies or in the world of work.

Your child's attendance is 85-89%

"AMBER - Take Care" as students will be missing up to 20 days each year and this will make it very difficult for them to achieve their best.

Your child's attendance is 80-84%

"RED light - Be Alert" as students are missing so much school that it will be very difficult for them to keep in touch with lessons or with work.

Your child's attendance is below 80%

"AT RISK - Immediate Action Needed" as students are missing so much time from school that it will be almost impossible for them to keep in touch with lessons or with work.

Portal or Sentral App. Select your child in the app, from the tab at the top, select student details, then under your child's picture, select attendance. From this area you will be able to see your child's percentage attendance for each term, plus the overall percentage for the year to date.

The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese. Please reach out to your child's teacher, or the school directly for survey guides in your language.

Last year we used the survey results to plan for student wellbeing and respectful relationships focus areas, developing student voice opportunities, focusing on developing our physical environment, and building communication practices.

AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

Grade 2/3:

This week, the Grade 2/3 students transformed into river detectives as they ventured to the Coliban River behind the MCG. Their exploration began with a close examination of the trees along the riverbank, where they observed both living and dead trees, noting their rings and discussing the crucial role trees play in the water cycle by absorbing water to thrive. The students then engaged in hands-on science by testing various aspects of the river's health, including pH levels, electrical conductivity (salinity), turbidity, reactive phosphorus and temperature. Their investigations also extended to identifying the diverse species of bugs residing in the river, offering a deeper understanding of the ecosystem and its delicate balance. The excitement blasted from the students, and their keen interest in the indepth investigations was truly evident throughout the afternoon. A big thank you to Chris Bromley for generously volunteering his time and expertise, helping our students gain valuable insights into the river and how to effectively advocate for our waterways.


