Grade Prep/1-

Grade 2/3-

This week in the grade 2/3 classroom we have been using conjunctions to expand our sentences so they can be utilised to their fullest extent. Children have been exploring ideas together as a class, connecting two simple sentences to form one compound sentence. It has been wonderful hearing all the creativity burst out from the children's minds.

Grade 3/4-

In Grade 3/4 this week we have been focusing on addition and subtraction through a variety of different strategies such as splitting and vertical algorithms. We have also focused on renaming place value to help us solve a vertical algorithm for both addition and subtraction. Next week we will be focusing on multiplication and division.

CROSS COUNTRY 2023

The Malmsbury PS House Cross Country is fast approaching and I am now on the lookout for volunteers to stand at course checkpoints during the event. Prep, grade 1 and grade 2 students will participate in a Fun Run around the oval. 9 and 10 year old students will run a 2km track and 11 and 12 year old students will run a 3 km track. This age grouping is based on the <u>age they turn by the end of 2023.</u>

SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

For 2023, school council elections must be completed by March 31st.

School Council members are elected to serve for a period of 2 years. This year we have the following members whose 2 year tenure is coming to a close:

This means that there will be a call for nominations for 4 positions to be filled for the next 2 years (Community Members are appointed through a different system). Vacating councillors are more than welcome to nominate for the positions again. If there are more nominations than vacant positions, we will then work through a voting process to appoint people to the positions.
