AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

Prep/1 Classroom:

It has been a smooth return to learning after the nearly 3 week break, with all the Turtles refreshed, rejuvenated and ready to get back into learning.

And learning is what we have been doing! In Literacy we are looking at sentences and what they need to be a sentence. We have looked at verbs and nouns and ending periods! In Maths, we have surveyed our class to see what our friends did in the holidays. We came up with our own questions, collected the data and then represented the information in a bar graph. Clever cookies, we are!

We have also looked at measuring distance between two points... we had a lot of fun estimating and finding the actual distance of the soccer pitch using our bodies. We discovered that it takes a great number of hand spans and not many body lengths... and it took Solomon a whole extra 3 body lengths than Thomas, whom is slightly taller than Solomon! Check out the fun we had below.



2/3 Classroom:

This week in the grade 2/3 classroom, we have been learning units of measurement. We started off exploring the classroom and measuring with informal units of measurement. Next, we extended our knowledge and measured specific parts of our bodies using a one metre ruler. We explored volume and capacity, comparing different sized containers and examining their difference using water. This directed our learning towards millilitres and litres, where we utilised our measuring skills and made ourselves a fruity drink using different flavours of juice. We have had a lot of hands on fun this week, learning about the different units of measurement and how they relate to our everyday lives.



3/4 Classroom:

This week in Grade 3/4 we have been focusing on length in measurement and identifying what different units of measurements (millimetres, centimetres, metres and kilometres) look like. We have been identifying different objects and what unit of measurement would be required to measure them accurately. In the coming weeks we will be moving into measuring the area of an object.
