The AtoSS is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education to Grade 4,5 and 6 students to assist schools to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Students will be asked about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general.

This year, the AtoSS will be conducted at school from Monday the 15th of May to Friday the 26th of May.
