School Reports:

As mentioned earlier, teachers have been very busy over the past few weeks, assessing, tracking, and writing our students' reports. You will also be able to access the reports digitally through the Sentral Parent Portal and Sentral App. This function will appear on the portal Wednesday afternoon.

Grade 5/6 Parent Teacher Interviews next week 19th to 22nd June:

Next Monday through to Thursday, the grade 5/6 parents will have their Parent/Teacher interviews. Both Emily and Christie will be at the interviews to help with the transition process. The interviews are now booked through the Sentral Parent Portal, as per the communications that were sent to these families on Wednesday. A majority of families have already booked their times, but there are still plenty of timeslots available. The booking system is open up until Sunday afternoon. Please contact Emily if any remaining timeslots don't suit and she will organise an alternative time. If you have any trouble using the Sentral parent interview booking system, please let me know and I can provide support around this.

Berry St Education Model Training:

This week, our a number of our staff were able to complete the Berry Street Education Model training. The Berry Street Model is based on Trauma Informed Practices that help support the development of strong wellbeing practices with a focus on identifying student wellbeing needs and applying proactive strategies to support student self regulation of their wellbeing. Over the remainder of the year, we will begin implementing a number of strategies to help support students to recognise their emotions and have greater control of how to self regulate. I look forward to seeing the progression in this model as we continue to implement and monitor progress.

Community Groups Return in Term 3:

Next term will see the return of our Community Groups Program. This will run for a 4 to 5 week block in Term 3. Day and dates are yet to be confirmed until we know how many groups we will be running.

In term one, groups included Sport, Gardening, Food Appreciation and Boardgames. I have had a handful of people discuss some activities that they would like to run and I am keen to hear of any others that you may be interested in sharing with our students. 
I soon discovered that our morning routine was not going to follow our 'normal', and we soon found ourselves at the Frog Bog to witness the new addition!

Are you eligible for help with child care fees?

From July 2023, **Child Care Subsidy (CCS)** is increasing. Some families previously not eligible will now get it.

The changes mean early childhood education and care is now more affordable for more families.

Making early childhood education and care more affordable has benefits for children and their families, communities and Australia.

From July 2023:

More families will be eligible

Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander children can get at least 36 hours of subsidised care.



What you need to know



The maximum amount of CCS is increasing from 85% to 90% for families earning \$80,000 or less.

90%

Families earning over \$80,000 and under \$530,000 may get a subsidy starting from 90%. Depending on their income, the subsidy will go down by 1% for each \$5,000 of income they earn.



The income limit for CCS is increasing to \$530,000 a year. This means more families will be eligible.



Families earning below \$362,408 with more than one child aged 5 or under in care can get a higher rate of CCS for one or more of their children.



Families with Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander children can get at least 36 hours of subsidised care per fortnight for that child. This is regardless of their family's activity level.

What you need to do

If your family earns below \$530,000 you may be entitled to CCS from 10 July. Check your eligibility for CCS by **making a claim** using your Centrelink online account through myGov or your Express Plus Centrelink mobile app.

If you have an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander child

From 10 July 2023, families can get at least 36 hours of subsidised care per fortnight for each Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander child in their care and attending child care. Families may get more than 36 hours of subsidy per fortnight based on their circumstances and the amount of recognised activity they do.

If you would like to get at least 36 hours of subsidised care, you should contact Services Australia to update your child's CCS details. It's voluntary for you to tell Services Australia this. For more information go to Services Australia.


