AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

Grade Prep/1:

This week in Prep/Ones, we have been busy improving our spelling, using a few different strategies. One fun strategy is using picture cards and think about the phonemes in the word and then write it. Our Preps can write words with up to 5 phoneme sounds! We also have explored split digraphs, where the vowel team is split, but they still influence each other. We are truly clever little turtles!

Grade 2/3:

Every Tuesday afternoon, the grade 2/3 classroom explores a range of digital technologies. This week we explored the coding program, coding.org. In this technology session, the students took part in an introductory experience with coding and computer science in a safe and supportive environment. Students were able to watch demonstrative videos (a sort of how to do video), where they were taken through step by step on how to code their Minecraft characters around to collect treasures. The children were quite engaged with this lesson and were very proud of themselves, for being successful in their coding journey. And so was I!

Grade 3/4:

This week in 3/4 we have been working on inferring. We have learnt that inferring is taking clues from a text and working out what the author is telling us. We have been applying these skills to our class text The Afghanistan Pup.

Over the last two weeks, Maya, Audrey, and Sorcha have been running a drawing club on Thursday lunchtimes. It is great to see so many student make use of this quiet time in the library, showing their creativity. Well done for setting up this club.

















Are you eligible for help with child care fees?

From July 2023, Child Care Subsidy (CCS) is increasing. Some families previously not eligible will now get it.

The changes mean early childhood education and care is now more affordable for more families

Making early childhood education and care more affordable has benefits for children and their families. communities and Australia.



More families will be eligible

Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander children can get at least 36 hours of subsidised care.

What you need to know



The maximum amount of CCS is increasing from 85% to 90% for families earning \$80,000 or less.

Families earning over \$80,000 and under \$530,000 may get a subsidy 90% starting from 90%. Depending on their income, the subsidy will go down by 1% for each \$5,000 of income they earn.



The income limit for CCS is increasing to \$530,000 a year. This means more families will be eligible.



Families earning below \$362,408 with more than one child aged 5 or under in care can get a higher rate of CCS for one or more of their children.



Families with Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander children can get at least 36 hours of subsidised care per fortnight for that child. This is regardless of their family's activity level.

What you need to do

If your family earns below \$530,000 you may be entitled to CCS from 10 July. Check your eligibility for CCS by making a claim using your Centrelink online account through myGov or your Express Plus Centrelink mobile app.

If you have an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander child

From 10 July 2023, families can get at least 36 hours of subsidised care per fortnight for each Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander child in their care and attending child care. Families may get more than 36 hours of subsidy per fortnight based on their circumstances and the amount of recognised activity they do.

If you would like to get at least 36 hours of subsidised care, you should contact Services Australia to update your child's CCS details. It's voluntary for you to tell Services Australia this. For more information go to Services Australia.


