2023 Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey:

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents / caregivers / guardians think of our school. The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behavior, and student engagement. The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.

AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

Grade Prep/1:

This week in Prep/Ones, we have continued to explore the Australian currency and their value. We are extremely clever cookies and can identify the coins we need to purchase an item, add the values and are starting to work out the correct change! Phew, very clever turtles!

Grade 2/3:

We have been working on our writing skills this week in the Grade 2/3 classroom. We have been using our voice and reading texts, using the punctuation to guide our expression. The students have been creating some wonderful writing pieces, using their punctuation to guide their voice. Next week we will work on this further and look at other forms of stories, to further provide an understanding of how punctuation may be used.

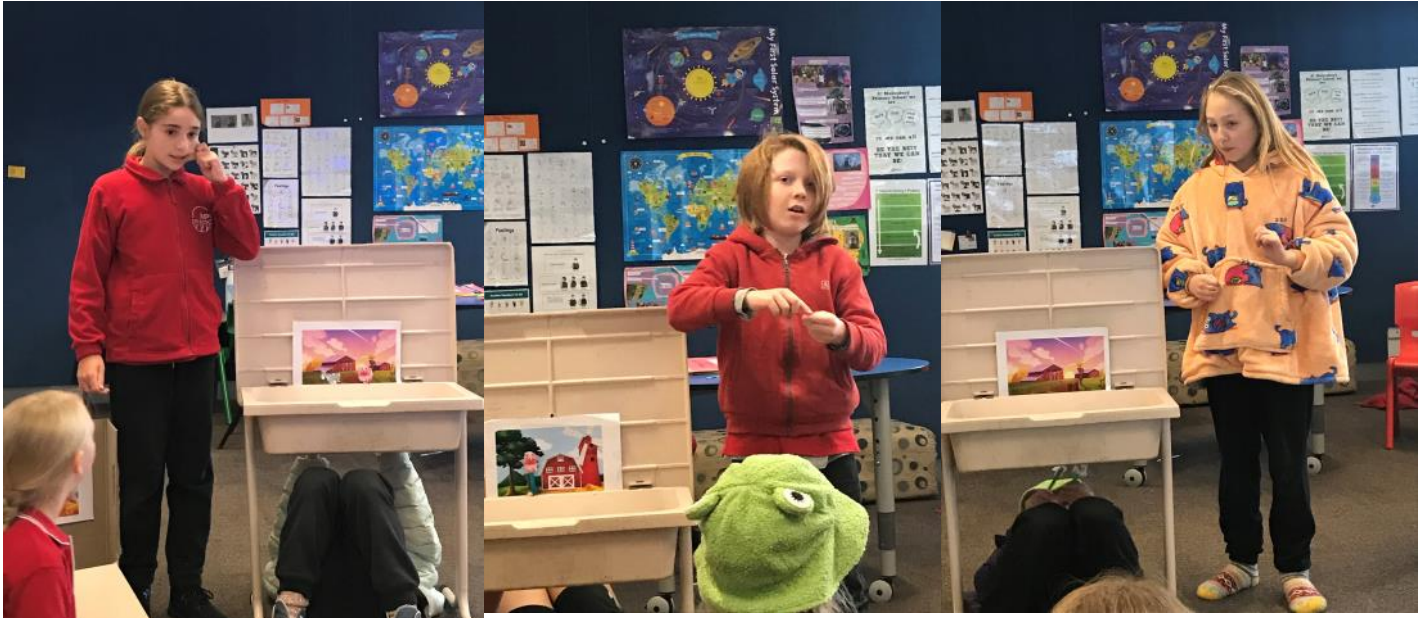
Grade 5/6:

This week in the grade 5/6 classroom we continued with our investigation of yeast and explored how it reacts in different temperatures. Students placed yeast, sugar, and water in small plastic bottles with a balloon on top. They hypothesised that yeast would react the most with the hot water, meaning that balloon would grow the most. But surprisingly, we discovered that the warm water worked the best, and that hot temperatures kill the yeast.

Students this week have finalised their information reports on topics of their choice, using Google Docs and practicing submitting assignments online. I have noticed a big improvement in their paragraph structures and looking forward to seeing this learning come through in our next assignment.

AUSLAN

During Auslan this term and last, all students have been learning about pets, farmyard animals and how to describe them, culminating this term in them pairing up and creating a dialogue about farm yard characters for a stick puppet play. All students, younger and older have creatively collaborated with others to construct sentences describing their animal puppets, using their ever developing grasp of Auslan.

Are you eligible for help with child care fees?

From July 2023, **Child Care Subsidy (CCS)** is increasing. Some families previously not eligible will now get it.

The changes mean early childhood education and care is now more affordable for more families.

Making early childhood education and care more affordable has benefits for children and their families, communities and Australia.

From July 2023:

More families will be eligible

Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander children can get at least 36 hours of subsidised care.



What you need to know



The maximum amount of CCS is increasing from 85% to 90% for families earning \$80,000 or less.

90%

Families earning over \$80,000 and under \$530,000 may get a subsidy starting from 90%. Depending on their income, the subsidy will go down by 1% for each \$5,000 of income they earn.



The income limit for CCS is increasing to \$530,000 a year. This means more families will be eligible.



Families earning below \$362,408 with more than one child aged 5 or under in care can get a higher rate of CCS for one or more of their children.



Families with Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander children can get at least 36 hours of subsidised care per fortnight for that child. This is regardless of their family's activity level.

What you need to do

If your family earns below \$530,000 you may be entitled to CCS from 10 July. Check your eligibility for CCS by **making a claim** using your Centrelink online account through myGov or your Express Plus Centrelink mobile app.

If you have an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander child

From 10 July 2023, families can get at least 36 hours of subsidised care per fortnight for each Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander child in their care and attending child care. Families may get more than 36 hours of subsidy per fortnight based on their circumstances and the amount of recognised activity they do.

If you would like to get at least 36 hours of subsidised care, you should contact Services Australia to update your child's CCS details. It's voluntary for you to tell Services Australia this. For more information go to Services Australia.
