AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

Grade 2/3:

This week for Science week, we explored how innovation can make farming better. We investigated how smart farms use innovation to look after their plants and animals through technology such as automatic irrigation, weather forecasting, and sensors that use satellites to connect the field to the farmhouse. We then imagined that we had our own farm and designed a robot to assist us on our own hypothetical farms. I can foresee a lot of the students in the grade 2/3 classroom, becoming engineers in the future. What creative minds we have!

Grade 5/6:


The 5/6's have been learning about the difference between "hypotheses" and "theories" in science over the last few weeks. Today was all about determining the "variables" within a given experiment. To this end we conducted the "Dancing Sultana" experiment by dropping some sultanas into a jar of soda water. Students initially wrote their hypotheses about what they predicted would happen before conducting the experiment, and then wrote down their observations of what they saw happening in the jar. At the end they could identify the several variables, such as the relative size and colour of the sultanas and quantity of soda water in each different jar. We finally discussed various theories about why the sultanas "danced" based on their observations of the experiment.
