
Grade 2/3:

For the final week of the term, in writing, the Grade 2/3 classroom have been exploring their imaginations and creating some really interesting pieces of writing. The students were challenged to write a one of a kind story. A story that deviates from their typical pieces of writing. To be successful in their writing, students were required to 'bump it up' by using simple, compound and complex sentences in their stories. They needed to use an appropriate amount of direct speech, a range of adjectives, verbs and adverbs and add some figurative language (similes, personification, metaphors, onomatopoeia). The students have done exceptionally well with this challenge and have produced some inventive pieces of writing. Well done Grade 2/3, for expanding your minds and stepping out of your comfort zones.

Grade 5/6:

What an amazing term 3 we have had in the 5/6 room; the kids have accomplished so much! The highlight has been watching everyone work together to create their short films. Students demonstrated their new knowledge of modal features to enhance meaning in their films and played with focalisation, salience, social distance, colour and subject gaze. They are also very funny! If parents would like a copy of their child's short film, please send them to school with a memory stick at the beginning of term, and I will upload those for you to watch at home.


