I would also like to send out a huge thanks to #teammalmsbury who provided all the organisation of the BBQ behind the scenes and for helping to get set up nice and early to make the most of the day. Thanks also go out again to the Malmsbury Bakery for organising all the sausages, bread, and rolls. I would also like to show a huge amount of appreciation to our local community member, Grant, who once again provided us with his time and baking expertise to provide us with a great variety of goods to sell at the stall. Grant always goes above and beyond for our BBQs and Market Stalls to help us raise vital funds for our school.

I am very happy to announce that the stall has once again proved to be a great fundraiser for the school, raising a total of \$1,545.15. An absolutely amazing effort and it is all thanks to the generosity of our community.

Emergency Evacuation Drills:

Since the start of the term we have run 2 drills. A 'shelter in place' and 'offsite evacuation' to the church. In both instances the drills went very well, and all processes and procedures were followed and actioned well by all staff and students. We have also completed a 'lockdown' drill with OSHC as part of their procedures for accreditation. We will be having another drill later in the term that will be a practice of evacuation from the school grounds into the main building. It is always a good time to speak to your children about the importance of these drills to help us be prepared for varying situations.

This week we also had to have a real evacuation from the yard to inside due to a swarm of bees that decided to make their hive in one of our gum trees near the soccer pitch. The students responded well to instructions and staff jumped into action quickly to help ensure students could be safely inside while we inspected the hive and set about organising for it to be removed. Thanks so much to Stewart Scott who was able to come in on Thursday to move the hive on.

Old Sports Shed- Reusable Materials:

Thanks to those community members who have been able to reuse and repurpose some of the materials from the old sports shed.

There are still have a variety of reusable materials leftover. All items are stacked down near the entry gate at the bottom end of the school. Please feel free to have a look through the pile for any items that you would like take with you. This week we will be removing the remaining items. MALMSBURY PS CATASTROPHIC FIRE RATING DAY PROCEDURES

With the Bushfire Season upon us, the school is well underway in preparing for the upcoming season. Malmsbury PS is on the 'Bushfire At Risk' register. This means that our school is closed on any Catastrophic Day and our OSHC service will also be closed. Below is our procedure to inform our school community of any Catastrophic Rating days that are declared.

- Malmsbury PS does not operate on a Catastrophic Day and no staff or students are permitted to be on the school premises.
- Catastrophic Days are declared at least 24 hours in advance.
- If a Catastrophic Day is declared during the school week then a note will be sent home from school to alert families to the school closure.
- A follow up phone call or Sentral message requiring a confirmation will confirm each family has received the notification regarding the Catastrophic closure.
- Staff will be phoned to confirm they know the school will be closed due to a Catastrophic Day being called.
- If a Catastrophic day is declared over a weekend for a Monday we will use the Sentral app, Facebook and phone calls to let parents know our school will be closed. Senior staff members will have home access to parent contact numbers in a secure location to enable parents to be contacted on weekends.
- Staff will be called to notify them of the Catastrophic Day closure declared over the weekend.
- Parents and staff will be reminded to monitor weather warnings over weekends until the bushfire season is over.
- Regular reminders will be placed in the newsletter about regularly checking the Sentral app and to follow us on Facebook for any notifications.

AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

Grade P/1:

This week in the Prep/one room, we have had a pretty cruisy week, I think we have all had 'Swim Week' fatigue! But we still managed to achieve some great learning! We have looked at division in Numeracy and in Literacy, we looked at the Author's Purpose and why an author writes, is it to persuade, inform or entertain? We also managed to conduct our volcano experiments today, after the 'bees' mucked up our timetable. Check out some of the photos below! Grade 2/3:

This week in the Grade 2/3 classroom we have been fine tuning our writing abilities. We have had a focus on paragraphs and how we can structure our writing to engage our chosen audience. The students have been working together and learning from one another, as they engage in conversations surrounding our chosen topic. It has been wonderful to see the collaborative capability the students have in the Grade 2/3 classroom and how far they have come with their learning this year.

Grade 5/6:

This week in the 5/6 room students have been finalising their persuasive pieces, it's great to see so many students using the persuasive techniques that we have picked out of all the different types of texts we have read over the last few weeks. In numeracy, students have been exploring fractions. I am so proud of the persistence students are showing with some more difficult equations.

We began our STEAM project this week, and students have begun designing a prosthetic leg. If you have any materials at home that might be useful, please bring them into class by next Friday when we start to bring the creations to life.

Yard Rubbish Team:

Thanks so much to Andrew, Evie, and Solomon (not pictured) who took it upon themselves to help clean up around the new toilet building site. These students notice a range of materials that were lying around after the temporary fencing was removed. PHOTO SETTINGS - UPLOAD



Image Type - Select DOCUMENT (if scanned as Photo it will show paper imperfections and make plate look dirty.

Resolution - should be set at least 300dpi high resolution. Colour: should be RGB.

Save file as - either JPEG (JPG) or PDF.
