AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

Grade P/1:

This week has flown by, I cannot believe it is the end of week 5 already, next week will fly with the public holiday and the Grade 1/2 camp, and we will be halfway through the term! Whilst Grade 1's are on camp, our Preppies will be working alongside their buddies in the 5/6 room. I think they are looking forward to that!

Grade 2/3:

In Grade 2/3 we have started to revise previously taught mathematical concepts. This week we went back and had a look at multiplication. We had a look at strategies to assist us in solving multiplication problems. We had a look at the best ways to solve worded multiplication problems and how sometimes they are worded, to encourage deeper mathematical thinking. We revised how arrays, repeated addition and using equal groups may assist us in answering multiplication problems. It has been wonderful to see all the growth the students in the Grade 2/3 classroom have made this year. I am very proud of all the efforts each child has made this year in the Grade 2/3 classroom, to assist their learning. Well done!

Grade 3/4:

This week Grade 3/4 have been getting familiar with Australian history. Using the picture book 'My Place' as a starting point, we have begun looking at how our area has changed throughout time and started to think about how significant historical events might have impacted life in Malmsbury. We still have lots of research and investigation to do, don't be surprised if you get asked about where you live or what life was like in the 'olden days!'

We have also been looking at maps, identifying the features that help read maps and navigate. We have looked at print and Google Earth maps of our school, and will use our map-reading skills to look at how the land in Malmsbury has changed over time.

Grade 5/6:

We have had a great week in the 5/6 classroom. We have delved right into our Inquiry topic of the term, local history. Students have been exploring stories of Australian immigrants through artefacts and pictures. We have also investigated the impacts of colonisation on Indigenous Australians.

This week in STEAM, many students completed their prosthetic legs. It has been great to see students use their problem-solving and collaboration skills to create working prosthetic legs.

MALMSBURY PS STREET LIBRARY!!!

We are thrilled to announce that we now have a Street Library at MPS! Many of you will have spotted the small, bright yellow house perched above the front fence when you walked in the gate... this is our Street Library!

Street Libraries are a beautiful home for books, planted in our front yard. They are accessible from the street, and are an invitation to share the joys of reading with your neighbours.

Street Libraries are a window into the mind of a community; books come and go; no-one needs to check them in or out. People can simply reach in and take what interests them; when they are done, they can return them to the Street Library network, or pass them on to friends.
