AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

Prep/1:

WOW, what another great week in our room we have had! We have continued to explore our classroom environment and build great long-lasting relationships. Check out the photos below! The smiles say it all! A big shout out to our Preppies who are our new rhyming experts! I often hear, 'that rhymes' when I'm reading a storybook. I can't wait to see what we learn next week! A bigger shout out to our Grade Ones who have been great positive role models, helpers and 'teachers'. It is a lot easier to learn our classroom expectations by watching other peers than to listen to me reminding them!











Grade 2/3:

This week in the Grade 2/3 classroom, we have been focusing on our daily routines and learning about all the new features of our classroom. In Maths, we have been investigating number sequences and challenging ourselves to expand our knowledge. In Auslan, we learnt how to sign the alphabet and spell out our names. We started our Inquiry unit this week, where we will be focusing on learning about 'who we are'. Throughout the term, we will look into our own personal family histories and cultures and share with one another, what makes us unique. I encourage all families, to have conversations with your child about their family history and culture. This will enable students to come to school, with knowledge about who they are and what makes them unique. I look forward to hearing all the stories and the diverse cultures we have, in grade 2/3.

Grade 3/4:

Wow! What a great start the Legends of Grade ¾ have made to their year! We have been getting familiar with routines and working on creating a safe and supportive classroom. We have been trying to incorporate Auslan in our learning, particularly during our Morning Circle - test your child's knowledge by asking them to tell you how they feel or their faviourite colour in Auslan. They know a lot more than me!

We have been looking at our school values and exploring what they look like in action in the classroom - from how we approach our learning to how we get along with our classmates to how we look after the resources in our room, and everything in between. It has been great to see that every one of the Legends of Grade ¾ can explain our school values. This week we worked together to create our bedrock, which is going to be the metaphorical foundation that we build our learning and well-being on this year. Everyone was involved in drawing and painting and the end result is fantastic!

We are ready and excited for an amazing year of being the best that we can be!

Grade 5/6:

This week we have begun our class novel, War Horse by Michael Morpurgo. We have used our text to expand our vocabulary, with students using the words 'intrigued' and 'competent' in their writing. Students learnt how to use appositives, a phrase which describes a noun, in their writing and made some interesting sentences as a result! In maths we are reviewing our place value knowledge and expanding that further into decimals. We have also started adding and subtracting negative numbers in real life situations like temperature and floor levels in a building.

SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

For 2024, school council elections must be completed by March 31st.

School Council members are elected to serve for a period of 2 years. This year we have the following members whose 2 year tenure is coming to a close:

This means that there will be a call for nominations for 4 parent positions to be filled for the next 2 years (Community Members are appointed through a different system). Vacating councillors are more than welcome to nominate for the positions again. If there are more nominations than vacant positions, we will then work through a voting process to appoint people to the positions.

MALMSBURY PS CATASTROPHIC FIRE RATING DAY PROCEDURES

With the Bushfire Season upon us, it is important to know the following information and process.

Malmsbury PS is on the 'Bushfire At Risk' register. This means that our school is closed on any Catastrophic Day and our OSHC service will also be closed. Below is our procedure to inform our school community of any Catastrophic Rating days that are declared.

Malmsbury PS does not operate on a Catastrophic Day and no staff or students are permitted to be on the school premises.

Catastrophic Days are declared at least 24 hours in advance.

If a Catastrophic Day is declared during the school week then a note will be sent home from school to alert families to the school closure.

A follow up phone call or Sentral message requiring a confirmation will confirm each family has received the notification regarding the Catastrophic closure.

Staff will be phoned to confirm they know the school will be closed due to a Catastrophic Day being called.

If a Catastrophic day is declared over a weekend for a Monday we will use the Sentral app, Facebook and phone calls to let parents know our school will be closed. Senior staff members will have home access to parent contact numbers in a secure location to enable parents to be contacted on weekends.

Staff will be called to notify them of the Catastrophic Day closure declared over the weekend.

Parents and staff will be reminded to monitor weather warnings over weekends until the bushfire season is over.

Regular reminders will be placed in the newsletter about regularly checking the Sentral app and to follow us on Facebook for any notifications.


