On July 7th it is Tanabata, the star festival. Today in Japanese, the student learned about the story associated with Tanabata and we wrote wishes on colourful strips of paper (called tanzaku).





AROUND THE CLASSROOMS

Grade Prep/1:

Woohoo! The end of a very long term is here and just in the nick of time for us all! This week we have progressively slowed our learning pace and found some enjoyable quieter activities to engage in. We have enjoyed partner reading and have continued to enjoy measurement, this week looking at how heavier everyday objects are in our room. We measured using informal units, eg. teddies and measuring weights. It was interesting to see that scissors had the same weight as 3 large teddies and that they also weighed 45g. We also enjoyed the Wednesday afternoon when the 5/6's come in and shared their Nursery Rhyme Spoonerisms. They were so much fun, and we guessed them all correctly!









Grade 2/3:

We have had a lot of fun in the Grade 2/3 classroom over the past couple of weeks with our Measurement unit. The students have had multiple exposures in exploring how to measure length using familiar metric units (centimetres and millimetres). We all know how to use a ruler and or measuring tape to measure and then convert these measurements into millimetres. It has been wonderful to see the progress the students in the Grade 2/3 classroom have made this term with their understanding of measurement. This week we had a play with Area, and explored what a cubic centimetre is by creating robots with grid paper. We will explore this concept further in Term 3.











Grade 3/4:

Over the past few weeks, the grade 3/4 class has been developing their own Acknowledgement of Country. The students have been studying the purpose of the Acknowledgement and the aspects to be included. They are recognising the long history and connection with the land that the indigenous community have. It will be great to share this acknowledgement with the community once it is finalised.

Grade 5/6:

Last week the grade 5/6s finally got to present their debates which have been held back due to illness. Everyone was really brave presenting their arguments in front of their peers. I'm really proud of how the teams prepared and worked together.







We also took advantage of some beautiful weather, taking our maths outside. Students worked on solidifying their place value knowledge, doing subtraction and addition of larger numbers with regrouping.


Macedon Ranges Suicide Prevention Action Group will kick off the event with discussions about mental health and our suicide prevention efforts within the community.
